Provost Peter Nicholls has appointed Dr. Salome Raheim as the new Dean for the University of Connecticut School of Social Work. Dr. Raheim comes to us from the University of Iowa, where she served as the Director of the Social Work Program and Senior Associate to the President. With her national reputation in the field of Social Work and multiple leadership experiences in Social Work organizations, Dr. Raheim will "lead the faculty, staff and students to develop the next level of excellence," Provost Nicholls said. GREATER HARTFORD CAMPUS TO LAUNCH SERVICE-LEARNING PROGRAM

Our Greater Hartford Campus has been selected by the Provost's Office to launch Service-Learning at UConn. Service-Learning has existed in numerous forms at UConn, well before the concept of Service-Learning was fully articulated within education. Service-oriented internships, research grounded in community settings with community partners, and class projects focusing on community needs, have all steadily and successfully endured for decades within the institution. However, a lack of coordination rendered many activities virtually invisible within such a large and complex organization. Since the mid-1990s an evolving group of faculty and administrators involved in Service-Learning have met to collaborate and share information about existing activities and to advance a more coordinated system of Service-Learning within the University. The Urban Semester under the leadership of Dr. Louise Simmons, Associate Prof. of Social Work, is a notable example of the impact of Service-Learning upon students at UConn.

The UConn Service-Learning Advisory Committee and the Center for Teaching and Learning have been busy developing program guidelines, policies and procedures. In June the first of our Service-Learning Fellows will be announced for the 2008-2009 academic year. The UConn Greater Hartford Campus will host our first Service-Learning Institute on June 12-13, in the Zach's Community Room. Watch the Advance for detailed information. HONORS PROGRAM IN THE WORKS FOR GREATER HARTFORD CAMPUS

As our student population has grown, so has the need for honors classes for our students. To meet this need our Faculty Senate has given its approval to launch an honors program for students seeking further challenge or opportunity to explore a subject at a higher level. "We have been looking at the models they've been using at Stamford and Storrs and will adapt a program using the best of both," says Siskanna Naynaha, who has been appointed as Coordinator of the Honors Program at the Greater Hartford Campus. In the fall she will obtain faculty input on their interest and ability to incorporate honors classes and to determine what form such classes might take – Interdisciplinary Seminars, Honors Seminars, honors sections of courses, etc. "By Spring 2009 we will be able to invite Juniors and Seniors who meet a certain G.P.A. to participate in our Honors Program," Siskanna says. She hopes to be able to offer honors classes to freshman and sophomores in Fall 2009. Honors Programs have been determined to be one of the "best practices" for fostering success and retention among university students. 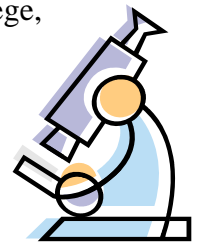
- 1) Never give up.

Started by five students at William & Mary College in Williamsburg, Virginia, in 1776 to promote freedom of inquiry and liberty of thought and expression, Phi Beta Kappa is the oldest and most widely known academic honor society in the United States. Only 10 percent of the institutions of higher learning have Phi Beta Kappa chapters, and only 10 percent of the arts and sciences graduates at these institutions are selected for Phi Beta Kappa membership.

We are all proud of Paula, a Biology Major who came from Cali, Columbia, six years ago with the hope of obtaining a better education. After learning English at Capitol Community College, Paula enrolled at our Greater Hartford Campus to pursue her dream of attending medical school. She heard about Dr. Felix Coe and asked him to advise her. “Dr. Coe not only becomes your teacher and advisor, but he becomes your mentor and friend. That really made a difference for me in being able to push myself,” Paula said. She also is grateful for the support she received from Dr. John Jardin in chemistry and Dr. G. EDIFYING PSYCHOLOGY POSTER PRESENTATION

Thank you Dr. Kerry Marsh and Psychology 202 research students for the informative and thorough Poster Presentations in the Art Gallery on May 1st. Students prepared and explained poster summaries of their class research projects. Students conducted laboratory experiments on (a) whether environmental lighting influences feelings of success (Emily Breininger, Genesis Coss, Avital Jaipershad); (b) whether the tempo of music has an effect on mood (Rivkah Freeman-Dasent, Joshua Rubock, Katrina Williams, Karlene Wolliston); (c) whether studying under silent versus noisy conditions affects memory (Edith Middleton-Morales, Christine Nogueira); (d) what variables can influence first impressions (Jamie Brownstein, Holly Harris, Kara Skehan); (e) whether the attractiveness of job candidates affects perceptions of who should be hired (Christine Fox, Erin Furniss, Karina Garcia, Magdalena Truszkowski); and (e) whether exposure to body-focused advertisements is perceived to influence body image (Jason Clarke, Nicole Egletes). The results of students’ experiments, which will remain in the gallery for a few weeks, suggest that it is better to study in a silent rather than noisy environment, and that fast music can increase feelings of happiness and decrease sadness, with women’s sadness being more affected by slow tempo than men’s. We welcome and look forward to future presentations from all our advanced study students as academic exchange broadens our perspectives and provides an ideal opportunity for cross- disciplinary inspiration.
